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## District Administrator News

Happy New Year everyone! We are grateful for the opportunity to work with each of you and educate your children. There are many great things going on in Tigerton Schools! Congratulations to Coaches Meverden and Hauser and the volleyball team on their Regional Championship season. Monika Minniecheske also earned State Honorable Mention! We hope the success found on the court continues for our basketball teams, too. We are proud of the work our teachers and students do in and out of the classroom. You may have noticed the greenhouse project has been completed! Many wonderful plants will be grown by Ms. Rowe and her agriscience classes for use in class, our food service, and for sale. Thank you to all who helped make it a reality!

Our new scoreboards are on their way and the sound system fundraiser is in full swing. The sound system is in dire need of an upgrade and our goal is to make our gymnasium the perfect venue for all sporting events, concerts, programs, and graduations in Tigerton. Please consider donating to support this goal. Any money above the target will go toward upgrading our stage area. The stage will be host to "101 Dalmatians," a musical put on by Ms. Pope and her students, this March. Be sure to watch out for more information!

The 2017-18 District and School Report Cards have been released. Our district scores are solid, as we met expectations, but we are below where we want to be. Our continued focus on more rigorous standards and curriculum/assessment writing will allow our students to achieve at higher levels. While our historical scores have gone up and down, the fluctuations are attributed to weighting in the areas of school growth and closing the gaps. We are a small district and the impact of a few students can affect our scores. We are focused on working with each child to provide them the best learning experience for them. The Report Cards only tell part of our story. Test scores are important, but we believe education is about academic, artistic, emotional, athletic, social, and civic growth. We work to ensure our students and graduates are tremendous assets to our community, our state, our nation, and our world.

We are proud of the work we have done already and continue to focus on the work we are doing and have yet to do. We are evaluating all we do to create the best schools to learn and work in. As for parents, we want you to be engaged with your child to foster their curiosity, work ethic, and attitude about school and the world at large. Questions you can ask to get a dialogue going about school—What was the funniest thing that happened at school? What word did the teacher use most today? Tell me something good that happened today. What was the best part of lunch? Tell me three times you used (your pencil, your chromebook, a tool) today. These are not meant to be the only questions you ask, just a different icebreaker about school that could get a deeper conversation going.

## Recent Tigerton FFA Activities:

- National FFA Convention--Allen Jobe, Bethany Jobe, Steven Parrott, and Ms. Rowe traveled with six other area schools to the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis in October.
- Mitchell Schroeffer, State FFA Treasurer from Antigo, came to THS for a FFA Chapter Visit on November 15. We learned about FFA opportunities, setting goals, and leadership skills.
- Sweet Hunting Reminders--350 safe hunting reminders were attached to Snickers miniatures and given to four area businesses to distribute to hunters during the Gun Deer Season.
- Operation Christmas Cheer Project—Assembled and delivered 32 holiday gift bags filled with fresh fruit and other snacks to Tigerton elderly and those needing extra holiday cheer.

A few thoughts about Convention:

I was lucky enough to go to the National FFA Convention this year. It was very fun. We got to see Garth Brooks sing, "I Got Friends in Low Places" and other songs in a private FFA concert. Along the way, we stopped and walked through barns full of cows in southern Wisconsin, the Chicago High School of Agrisciences, and a fancy glass place. At the convention, we went to the FFA Shopping Mall, the Career Expo, and Lucas Oil Stadium where the Colts play (where concert was). In the sessions, we learned that just one person can make a difference. The music at the end of the session was my favorite part. I had fun on this trip and learned a lot. ~ Bethany Jobe

I am the treasurer for the Tigerton FFA Chapter and had an extraordinary experience in Indianapolis this year. We started our trip at Clintonville High School where we boarded a coach bus to head down to Rosy-Lane Farms near Watertown, Wisconsin. Next was the Chicago High School of Ag Sciences. The school has many opportunities for the students in the ag field—like animal and food sciences, biotech, ag finance, ag mechanics, and even aquaponics. They had many animals like pigs, cows, chickens, and turkeys on the only farm located in Chicago. We also toured Kokomo Opalescent Glass Company, which has been in business since 1887. We then visited the Indy 500 Speedway and Museum. I learned that the Indy 500 is not located in Indy, but is actually located in Speedway, Indiana. I got to see some cars and ride around the race track. We went to a few sessions where our group saw the national FFA officers! ~ Allen Jobe

The 91st National FFA Convention & Expo was my third convention I attended. This year the tours were very interesting, from visiting Rosy-Lane Holsteins to the Indy 500 track. Our first stop was the farm tour. They milk 3X/day for 22 hours. With an excellent genetic herd, they sell offspring to A.I. breeding companies, as well as embryos all over the world. We also saw a glass company in rural Indiana. This was really cool to see how they make the glass, from the furnaces to the presses. Once we got to Indianapolis, we went to our first general session followed by the Garth Brooks concert. Our last tour was the Indy 500 track which we got to take a lap in a small coach bus and watched a video showing the history of the track. Throughout the sessions and exploring the awesome Ag Career Expo that displayed tractors, trucks, and other Ag related booths. I reunited with friends I had met throughout my career as an active FFA member. ~ Casey Wuske

# THS Math News by Ms. Krolow

On November 28, this year's THS Math Team competed at the University of WI-Stevens Point. Our team consists of three categories: geometry, (advanced) algebra, and advanced math (including trigonometry, precalculus, and statistics). The team competes as individuals and they also earn a school score. The geometry team members are Mitchell Zimdars, Triton Elfert, Dawson Block, Justin Knaup, Mary Kreklow, and Ladia Block. The algebra team members are Nathaen Wanta, Bethany Kreklow, Savannah Swartz, Adrienne Brady, and Allen Jobe. The advanced team members are Gracie Zimdars, Ireland Miller, John Uttenreither, Raven Dewhurst, and Monika Minniecheske. Each team member completes a 55-minute exam that is written by mathematics' professors. There are three meets during the school year. In this first competition, senior Gracie Zimdars led the advanced team with a division ranking of 21st out of 71 students; junior Nathaen Wanta led the algebra team with a division ranking of 1st out of 76 students; sophomore Mitchell Zimdars led the geometry team with a division ranking of 19th out of 74 students. Junior Bethany Kreklow had a great algebra score within our division to place with a ranking of 7th. Freshman Mary Kreklow also had

an impressive finish in the geometry category. Our students did an amazing job and there is one more highlight. Nathaen Wanta ranked 1st in our algebra division but he also ranked 1st out of 201 algebra students from all four divisions. These mathletes as a school team finished with a team ranking of 8th out of 19 schools in our division. The second meet will be held in January and the final meet of this school year will be in March. We wish the math team continued success. All of these students are an incredible bunch of kids and Ms. Krolow is very proud of all of you. Go mathletes!!

## Open Enrollment Information

Beginning February 4, 2019, parents of non-resident students may apply for Open Enrollment to the School District of Tigerton. Public School Open Enrollment is the program that allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live.

The program for the School District of Tigerton is open to students in five year-old kindergarten to grade 12. It also applies to four year-old kindergarten students provided the district of residence also operates the program.

The open enrollment application period for the 2019-20 school year runs from February 4 to April 30, 2019. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2019. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.
